The following tests have been made non orderable in HAC:

Manganese, Blood 2567/MNB

If requesting a Manganese, please order a 994/MSO and indicate Manganese in the test name

Viral Culture, Throat	4727/VTH
Viral Culture, Eye	4719/VEY
Viral Culture, Dermal	4725/VDM
Viral Culture, NP	4722/VNA
Viral Culture, Genital/Oral	4721/VCG
HSV Culture, Child	5852/U12
HSV Culture, Non-GYN	5880/OHR
RSV Culture	4740/RSC

The above tests have been replaced by the **Viral Culture, General; 7635/VGC**. The source of the culture must be included when ordering this new test.



CYTOLOGY ORDER ENTRY INSTRUCTIONS REVISED

The Cytology Order Entry instructions included in the HAC User Training and Resource Manual have been updated to reflect the AML conversion to ThinPrep Pap testing. A revised document has been included with this newsletter. Please replace the document in your manual dated July 2003 with this new document dated November 2005.

CANCELLATION OF TESTING AFTER MANIFESTING

Once an HAC order has been placed on a manifest, the testing can not be cancelled by the client in the HAC system

If a provider notifies you that a test is to be cancelled after you have manifested the order, but before the specimen has been picked up by the courier, please do the following:

- Remove the specimen/order from the courier bag.
- On the manifest, cross the order out with one line and document "Cancel Testing" along with your initials and the date
- Fax the manifest with the documentation and the requisition to AML Customer Service at 612-863-4067
- Place the manifest back into the courier bag with the remaining specimens, keeping the specimen and requisition for the cancelled testing at your site.

If the specimen has already gone with your courier to AML, please complete an AML Add/Cancel/Delete Form and fax it to AML Customer Service at the number listed above.
